

# STUDENT ACCESS AND SUPPORT

Syracuse University's belief in Scholarship in Action attracts students with the drive and imagination needed to solve society's most pressing issues. They are the change agents of the future—empowered to make a real and lasting difference in their communities and the global society in which they live.

America's global competitiveness depends on these well-educated citizens of the world, yet many highly qualified low- to moderate-income high school students cannot afford to attend a four-year college. Middle-class students struggle as well. In fact, nearly 66 percent of SU's undergraduate students receive some form of need-based financial aid.

## Attracting Students of Talent and Promise

To attract academically gifted students regardless of socioeconomic background, SU must offer scholarships and fellowships that reward academic achievement and recognize financial need. But at just over \$1 billion, our endowment fund—the main source of need-based financial assistance—is modest compared to other private research universities. If we are to provide greater access to students and support services once they arrive on campus, we must significantly increase our endowment.

A top priority of The Campaign for Syracuse University is an increase of \$200 million in endowed and current-use funds for scholarships and fellowships.

As a donor, you can establish your own named endowed scholarship fund or contribute to one or more of the following scholarship programs.

## Haudenosaunee Promise Scholarship Program

Provides full financial assistance to all first-year and transfer students who are citizens of one of the six Haudenosaunee nations, in appreciation of the nations' historical, political, and cultural legacies.

## Remembrance Scholarships

Merit scholarships awarded each year to 35 seniors in memory of the 35 SU students killed in the 1988 Pan Am 103 terrorist attack.

## Coronat Scholarship Fund

Awards merit scholarships to those students with outstanding intellectual curiosity, accomplishment, and a commitment to serving others. Designed to engage students of the highest academic and personal caliber.



### Graduate Student Support

Comprehensive financial aid packages that enable SU to compete for the best graduate students from a wide range of life experiences, both here and abroad. These talented students engage with our faculty, helping to advance our research efforts. Support includes distinguished graduate fellowships (tuition and stipend), graduate fellowships (stipend only), and graduate scholarships (tuition support only).

### Our Time Has Come Scholarship Fund

Assists African American and Latino students who have financial need and demonstrate academic excellence.

### Chancellor's and Dean's Scholarships

Offered to entering freshmen with outstanding academic records.

### Scholarship Gifts

There are two types of scholarships—supported and endowed. With supported scholarships, the entire gift is spent. Endowed scholarships—the most powerful resources a donor can give—provide a steady stream of annual income from permanently invested funds.



## SCHOLARSHIP IN ACTION ARTHUR LIU INCITES MUTUAL UNDERSTANDING

Arthur S. Liu G'66 will never forget his days as a graduate student at the S.I. Newhouse School of Public Communications. At that time, the native of China worked 60 hours a week as a restaurant waiter to support his studies. The experience prompted Liu, now president and CEO of New York-based Multicultural Radio Broadcasting Inc., to establish the Liu Multicultural Scholarships at the Newhouse School to allow graduate students to focus on their studies.

Through a \$500,000 gift from the Liu Foundation, established by Liu and his wife, Yvonne, the \$10,000 scholarships are awarded annually to between 5 and 10 Newhouse graduate students interested in cross-cultural communication. The Liu Multicultural Scholarships play an important role in extending the global reach of the Newhouse School by promoting mutual understanding among people from different countries and diverse cultural backgrounds.

Whether supported or endowed, scholarships and fellowships can be funded with cash, bequests, or retirement funds, or with annuities or trusts that can be structured as a planned gift by SU or an outside entity, such as a bank.

Donors who increase student access through scholarship support enable tomorrow's leaders to pursue their dreams. They give young people a head start in life by lessening the burden of student loan repayments. And they show our students that they're valued members of the Syracuse University family.
